**CENTRAL UTAH WATER ENCOURAGES UTAH COMMUNITIES TO SAVE EVERY DROP**

*Board Adopts Resolution Amid Historic Drought*

*Orem, Utah* – Central Utah Water’s Board unanimously adopted a resolution formally acknowledging Utah’s ongoing drought conditions and called on all Utahns to champion water stewardship.

The resolution recognizes that Utah is currently experiencing one of the most persistent droughts on record, exacerbated by record-low snowpack and record-high temperatures. In response, the Board affirmed water conservation as an immediate and ongoing priority.

“Every drop conserved today puts us in a better spot tomorrow,” said Gene Shawcroft, General Manager of Central Utah Water Conservancy District. “Conservation is not just a short-term response. It is critical to provide reliable water supplies for our growing communities and for future generations.”

While the Central Utah Project was designed to carry the region through prolonged periods of drought, District staff remains committed to operational excellence and helping Utahns navigate periods of water scarcity.

“Drought requires each of us to be more thoughtful about our water use,” said Amanda Strack, Water Conservation Manager. “Small, water-efficient choices made over time have a compounding effect and add up to real water savings in our communities and beyond.”
